

#### **President's Report**

The North Carolina Chapter of the Appraisal Institute is continuing to closely monitor the developments surrounding COVID-19 (Coronavirus), and we are continuing to follow the advice given by the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> (CDC), the <u>World Health Organization</u> (WHO). As well, we continue adhering to restrictions imposed by our trusted elected leaders. We recognize that these restrictions are important in keeping the community safe, and in limiting the long-term effects of this outbreak.

In keeping with these guidelines and restrictions, we have cancelled all in classroom educational offerings and all scheduled chapter and branch events through to April 30, 2020.

As your chapter leader, I recognize that every person and every business is affected by the current circumstances in some way. Our members are greatly concerned about how this will impact their livelihood, and our industry as a whole. The board and I share those concerns, and we're doing everything we can to minimize the impact. We are in close daily contact with the National Chapter in an effort to fully understand the extent to which our industry may be affected so that we can work together and respond with measures to address those challenges.

Additionally, I've contacted our Governor's office and made the case that we should be included among the list of essential services, so that we can continue performing our services. We will report promptly on the outcome of this request.

We will make every effort to keep you up to date on any and all matters related to the current situation as it evolves daily. Please check our homepage regarding cancellations or rescheduled events, as well as any other changes taking place.

Dear Governor Cooper:

I am writing on behalf of the North Carolina Chapter of the Appraisal Institute (NCAI) and its 500+ members in the state of North Carolina to extend our sincere appreciation for the rapid response and unwavering attention to the COVID-19 pandemic that has upended our state. The dedication and commitment of you and your staff to the protection of the public has been commendable. We stand in support of the guidelines for protecting the health and safety of our citizens and our members.

While we understand the need to protect our citizens and our medical system from the overwhelming conditions brought about by the rapidly expanding COVID-19 pandemic, we are also concerned about the ramifications and unintended consequences to the real estate service industry if future restrictions are deemed necessary. Our members are performing critical and timely real estate appraisal functions for transactions that are occurring in the state during this crisis. To the extent that they must protect themselves and our citizens, they have made every effort to minimize all physical interactions with clients and property owners while still appraising properties for purchase transactions. Already, many client groups have changed their policies to allow for the use of exterior-only or drive-by appraisals where the appraiser remains inside their vehicle or performs the inspection without coming into contact with anyone. We want to respectfully encourage you and your staff to consider allowing these essential functions to continue without interference, even with the implementation of the most stringent restrictions on personal movement in the public space.

We believe our goal is similar to yours; to not only protect the health and wellbeing of the citizens of North Carolina, but also protect and preserve the very fabric of our community and the economic underpinnings that will be vital to our recovery when the worst of this pandemic passes. To that end, we humbly request that you and your staff work to minimize the potential interruptions to the real estate industry in general, and appraisal services specifically, by declaring real estate services as "essential services" under any emergency powers declaration. We further ask that all activities you deem "essential services" be exempt from additional or stricter local restrictions. Many other states and local communities have already acknowledged this essential service and made provision for its continued activity.

The North Carolina Chapter of the Appraisal Institute understands this pandemic will have an impact on the real estate industry and the economy. If we can keep processes running as smoothly and safely as possible, we can work together to limit the negative economic effects on our State and its citizens.

#### **2020 Education Report**

**UPDATE:** March 19<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> classes were cancelled and refunds were issued. We are going to release a USPAP virtual class to be taught by John Bosworth on Thursday, 4/2 using Zoom and we are working to ensure it will meet the new standards identified in the NCAB Emergency Rule Making meeting held the morning of March 24<sup>th</sup>. Furthermore, as all in person education is discontinued through the end of May, we are working to have the Advanced Market Analysis and HBU course to be held 5/11-5/15 taught in a virtual capacity as well.

We are in the midst of the 2020 USPAP update and these are our numbers to date:

On February 4, we had an education planning call with the following in attendance – Kelli Mayhew, Roger Webb, Jim Lynch, Mike Moody, Chris Johnson, Rocky McElhannon, Erica Butler, Lynn Carmichael, Grayson Morgan, Matt Benyon, and myself. We discussed the upcoming education including the homegrowns. We allocated people to work on the various homegrowns including Lynn Carmichael, Rich Earley, and myself for the eval/bifurcated seminar; Chris Johnson, Grayson Morgan, Mike Moody, Roger Webb and myself to work on the Cost Approach seminar; Rocky McElhannon, Matt Benyon, and myself to work on the REVC. I've held conference calls with the Cost Approach and Eval/Bifurcated groups in February and will be sending an outline of these calls to the groups as we work on planning and forming these homegrown seminars.

I've formed an Education Committee that consists of Mike Moody, Jim Lynch, Matt Benyon and Rich Earley. We had one call on February 7 to discuss the homegrowns and other education for the year.

In 2019, Education was profitable with \$114,749 in income and \$100,108 in expenses. From a budget perspective, income was 70% of the budgeted \$150,000, while the expenses were right on budget. Income was up 54% from 2017 and down 35% from 2018 which was a USPAP year. Education expenses reflect an 87% increase from 2017 and a 54% decrease from 2018 (USPAP year).

We expect education to perform closer to a 75% OER this year with using less expensive community college and non-profit venues. We will be working on a list of "go to" venues as well as secondary venues in each market to assist in future planning. Our budget was determined based on this and we need to make money in education. As we stand YTD in 2020, Education income is \$11,765 and Expenses are \$11,733. I would prefer we were higher on education and if we can hold the homegrown seminars, those are where we should be able to make money.

With regard to the Covid-19 pandemic, we are considering holding the two upcoming USPAP courses virtually and there is no education currently planned for April. We will need various approvals from the NCAB and are waiting for guidance from The Appraisal Foundation to make a decision in this regard.

We have projected a 5.84 percent increase in dues for 2020, which is based on the actual member count. We have projected a 10 percent reduction in education expenses, due in large part to the educations committees changes in venue selections. Spring 2020 update:

- 1. On January 8, 2020 we were asked to attend a round table discussion hosted by the NC Appraisal Board (NCAB) to discuss the topic of Hybrid Appraisals. NCAI sent Mike Moody, President-Elect, and Mike Elwell, Secretary, to the meeting to represent the chapter. NCAB also invited Scott Dibiasio, Manager of State and Industry Affairs with Al national, who attended in person. Also, in attendance, were members of various appraisal, banking and appraisal management advocacy organizations. The meeting centered around two main topics. 1) Can hybrid appraisals be legally performed by licensed real estate appraisers under the laws of North Carolina? 2) If they are legal, what are the proper standards to apply when and if NCAB needs to address a complaint related to a hybrid appraisal? Several advocacy groups are of the opinion that the current regulations for licensed appraisers in NC do not allow for hybrid appraisals, mainly due to the lack of supervision over the providers of significant appraisal specific information, like building condition and size. All of the groups, including NCAI/AI agreed that USPAP does not prohibit hybrid appraisals. NCAI/AI stressed that forms of this type of appraisal product are utilized often in the commercial appraisal business, so any new rules or regulations would need to avoid unintended consequences. The advocacy groups for residential appraisals are very suspicious of hybrid appraisals and they are working to create a ban or at least significant restrictions to make the use of these products very limited. NCAI/AI has adopted a wait and see approach regarding new rules/regulations at the state level as the national banking regulators have recently decided to wait on fully implementing hybrid appraisal products for residential appraisals. NCAB is currently processing the insights from the meeting to decide if they need to develop new rules, new legislation or simply write a newsletter article to address how they will enforce/interpret current legislation regarding hybrid appraisals for all licensed appraiser in NC.
- 2. Hybrid Appraisals Based on the January meeting and other meetings on this topic, the NC Appraisal Board published a discussion in the their latest newsletter regarding the boards

position/opinion on Hybrid appraisals and offered suggestions to appraisers who are considering doing these types of appraisals or who are already doing them. - 3. Sunsetting NCAB Frivolous Complaints GRC is continuing the process to survey NC professional licensing boards to determine their policies regarding dismissed complaints against licensed professionals. This task will help NCAI generate a plan to address NCAB regarding frivolous complaints against appraisers, with the hope that these types of complaints can be expunged from the appraiser's record with the state. The new proposed rules for NCAB include adding a process for NCAB staff to determine more quickly if a complaint is frivolous or if it has merit (57C.0101). Complaints without merit will be dismissed. While the intent is to dismiss the frivolous complaint, NCAB must still keep this allegation in the file of the appraiser involved and report such allegations to any inquiring agency or person.
- 4. Raleigh Updates The legislative updates/reports created and sent to NCAI by David Ferrell (NCAI lobbyist) will now be posted on our website. THM will send an email blast to members when the report is posted on the website.
- 5. Lobbyist David Ferrell will continue to be our lobbyist in Raleigh this year.
- 6. NCAI PAC news...

The current PAC balance is just over \$4,300. Our raffle at the December meeting generated over \$1,000. Thank you to all of you who participated. Another raffle will be held at the March meeting.

The PAC is building funds for the 2020 election, which includes the Governor's race. We can make a splash with candidates running for office if the PAC has the resources.

### **Investment Growth Strategy**

The Scholarship Committee plans to implement a fundraising program beginning in the second half of 2020. The program involves an automatic payment donation plan that NCAI members can setup through their bank accounts, and a potential donation portal on the NCAI website. The committee welcomes your questions, insight and feedback as we prepare the growth plan over the next few months.

As of January 1, 2020, the Scholarship Fund had a balance of \$87,165, which means that we have \$4,358.25 available for scholarship distribution in 2020. The available balance reflects the 5% base allocation each year. This year, Scholarship Committee plans to award both individual and group scholarships to NCAI members.

In 2019, the Scholarship, Education and Candidates Guidance Committees began working on a joint initiative to offer a group scholarship that would benefit NCAI candidates taking an eligible course offered through NCAI in 2020. The selected course is Advanced Market Analysis & Highest and Best Use, which will be offered on May 11 - 15, 2020 in Charlotte, NC. Registration is currently open. Tuition for AI members is \$900.

In order to determine the allocation of funds for individual and group awards, we recognized that the course selected for the group scholarship would primarily benefit candidates who were nearing the end of their course requirements. Therefore, we intend to focus individual scholarship awards on candidates at the beginning and end of the spectrum to ensure our candidate needs are served equitably.

In the first quarter of 2020, we received eleven (11) applications for scholarship; ten (10) of which were eligible for funds. In comparison, we received eight (8) applications in all of 2019. Our outreach to candidates with scholarship resources has been successful!

Among the ten (10) eligible candidates in 1Q2020, six (6) are relatively early in their respective careers, two (2) were seeking funds for Advanced Market Analysis & Highest and Best Use (which will benefit from our group scholarship program), and two (2) were seeking funds for the 2020 General Demo Capstone Workshop (which will be offered by Al National in North Carolina in September of 2020). Both of the advanced applicants could qualify for designation within twelve (12) months or less of taking the capstone course.

The Scholarship Committee recommends that we provide funds to all of these candidates. In order to do so, we are requesting an affirmative vote from the Board of Directors to release the excess earnings from 2019, which totaled \$3,509. In short, the Scholarship Fund earned more interest in 2019 than was spent on scholarships. We would like to use the excess earnings to fund a total of \$7,867.25 in

scholarships in 2020, which would reflect an investment of 9.03% based on the fund balance of \$87,165 on January 1, 2020. The funds would be allocated as follows.

The recommended strategy would fully deplete the 2020 funds, which meets our mission objective to facilitate and maximize the use of the available funds each year.

- The funding allocated for 2020 would provide full tuition scholarships for six members of the North Carolina chapter, and partial scholarships for a minimum of four or more members. Even if we only serve the ten applicants from 1Q2020, we will have exceeded the seven awards given in 2019. The total number of members served will depend on how many candidates sign up for Advanced Market Analysis & Highest and Best Use and the Capstone workshop.
- Of the ten courses taken by scholarship recipients, three courses will be offered through NCAI, two would be provided online and three would be provided by other AI chapters.
- The Scholarship Fund would help five chapter members pursue a certification in North Carolina, and five more pursue the MAI designation specifically. There were no applications for review designation candidates. There were no eligible applications for SRA designation candidates; however, one of those seeking NC certification intends to pursue the SRA.

**Required Action**: Affirmative vote from the Board of Directors permitting the release of an additional \$3,509 from the Scholarship Fund, which would allow for a total scholarship investment of \$7,867.25 or 9.03% in 2020. Any funds not used in the group scholarship offering due to inadequate demand would remain in the Scholarship Fund. The additional funding will not be used to offer individual scholarships.
